NOTICE TO MARINERS

FIRTH OF TAY

SESU- XL Pipes - Large Vessel Movement Firth of Tay

Mariners are advised that the 3 SESU-XL pipes towed in a floating condition are due to transit the Tay from Sea to a mooring in the middle of the river, South of Prince Charles Wharf on Thursday 8th July 2021. The Tow will arrive at the Fairway Buoy at approximately 1300 BST and will take several hours to complete the transit to her Moorings. The Tow will be assisted by sea tug "MV Bestla", Multicat "Forth Joustler" and two harbour tugs.



The Navigation channels will be closed for this planned movement to allow the safe navigation of the Tow and her towing vessels. All other vessels are required to keep well clear (minimum 200 metres) and must not impede or endanger the planned passage as per General Direction No 14.

An exclusion zone of 200m will exist around the red hatched area on the above chartlet to ensure the safety of the mooring operation.

During the mooring operation which may take 24-48 hours, there will be floating and semi-submerged mooring apparatus which would present a danger to water craft.

The Tow is weather dependant, and Dundee Harbour Radio can be contacted on VHF channel 12 for any updates.

This Notice will be self-cancelling on completion of the mooring of these pipes.
